### **Design Challenge**

- Wooden satellites and Martian houses made of wood

Researchers in Japan and Finland have been exploring how wood could be used in space.

Unlike satellites made of metal, glass, and ceramics, which litter space with waste and damage the ozone layer, wood burns fully upon re-entry and is a replaceable resource that can be grown in space.

Wood is an obvious choice for space structures. Since there is no oxygen in space, wood doesn't burn or rot. The strength of wood is the same as aluminum pound for pound. Tests at International Space Station using birch, cherry, and magnolia found that wood is remarkably resilient in outer space. Magnolia wood is favored so far, because its' cells are small and uniform in size, making the wood easier to work and less likely to split or break.



Japan's space agency (JAXA) and NASA plan to send a prototype satellite, called LingoSat, into orbit in the summer of 2024. Researchers will monitor the satellite for at least six months as it orbits the Earth. Finnish startup Arctic Astronautics designed and built the WISA Woodsat, and is currently scheduling a launch.

I have confidence that the world's scientists can build satellites and space houses if the promise of wood pans out. But I seriously doubt that they can design them to look good. That's where wood carvers can have a role.

When I look around at CWCA meetings, I see a lot of design talent. Much of it goes into producing designs that have been carved for millennia. If we want to attract young carvers, and ensure that space vehicles and houses don't turn out "Boxy, but nice" or "Curved but boring", we should start working on prototypes to help NASA. Make them cool, edgy – something that when they are seen by beings from other worlds will make them think: "Man those Earthlings can turn out some sweet hardware when they want to. They fly and live in style".
