Gourd Carving







Gourd carving is a captivating and ancient craft that transforms dried carving gourds into a variety of things. This artistic practice has been around for thousands of years and is found in cultures worldwide, including Africa, Asia, and the Americas.

You start with the right type of gourd, which can be hard-shell (Lagenaria) or soft-shell (Cucurbita). The gourd is then dried and cured to prepare it for carving.

Alternatively, you can buy the dried and cleaned gourd from a variety of on-line sources and even at craft stores (including Walmart). Gourds come in a variety of sizes and shapes to accommodate your vision.
