Tips, Tricks, & Trivial Ideas – Shrink Pots

Green wood crafts are all the rage of late. This one was new to me when I heard it this past weekend.

Step 1 – Hollow out a section of freshly cut branch or log. You can take it close to the cambium layer.

Step 2 – Cut a shallow groove in the end that you would like to be the bottom of the container.

Step 3 – Carve a piece of seasoned wood, which matches the profile of the bottom end. It should be sized such that it requires a reasonable amount of pressure to force it into the groove.

Step 4 – Pop it in, finish edges a bit, and embellish it if you choose. You have just made your first shrink pot! As the green wood dries and shrinks, it locks the bottom in place. This practice pre-dates barrels.

Message from the Prez


To my fellow carvers.... Tis the season.....
